

Biography of Dr. Khorshed Alam (1929 - 2014)

It was during Subhe Sadik (Arabic word, in English, Astronomical dawn - is the moment when the geometric center of the Sun is 18 degrees below the horizon in the morning.) when Dr. Khorshed Alam was born in a village called Kashimnagar under Monirampur Thana of Jashore district. In Gregorian calendar, the date was 10th of June 1929. Myth says, Subhe Sadik is an auspicious moment to born. He was the son of Late Shariat Ullah Sardar and Kachirun Nesa. He lost his mother when he was just 13. Later, in 1962 he lost his father too.

Dr. Khorshed Alam had a rich academic career. He went to study at a junior Madrasa and completed his education in 1943 followed by senior Madrasa in the year 1949. Then he completed LMP in 1956, HMB in 1958 and DHMS in 1972. He was appointed as a Vice Principal of Jashore Homoeopathic Medical College and Hospital in the year 1959 and in 1964 he was promoted as Principal and continued his success journey with this medical college until 2006.

He started practicing of homoeopathy in the year 1950 and in the same year he founded Alam Homoeo Pharmacy - the milestone organization in the field of homoeopathic remedy. He was one of the most influential physician of his era to significant change in embracing homoeopathy treatment as an alternative way of cure.

Dr. Khorshed Alam was an inspirational and influential physician. He had the capacity to move and uplift his patients who literally didn't have any hope of cure. In particular, he could offer a vision of hope. He was generous too by offering free services to the poor and needy. The primary objective of this mission was to look after the general people couldn't afford of higher treatment cost. He worked tirelessly to deliver real benefits for the treatment. The charismatic man died on 19th of February 2014 aged 85.

It was Thursday on 27th September 1956, Dr. Khorshed Alam got married to Mrs. Lutfa Alam who later was awarded as "Rotno Gorva" (Bengali word and it's English meaning is "Womb of Jewels") Together they had FIVE daughters - Mrs. Rawshan Ara Zaman, Director (PSC) Mrs. Rohima Sultana, DGM (DPDC) Late Dr. Jamila Sultana, DHMS, Bsc(Hon.), Msc, Former high officials of NGO-Association for Disabled People, Mrs. Shahanaz Sultana, LLB(Hon.), LLM, District Judge Bagerhat Judge Court, Mrs. Bilkis Sultana, Bss(Hon.), MA, SPO, AB Bank, Jashore and TWO sons - Dr. S.M.Abdullah, DHMS, Bsc, Practicing Homoeopathy and Dr. S.M.Robiul Alam, MBBS, DHMS, Former Medical Officer/Superintendent Police Hospital, Jashore.
